







ACTIVITY GUIDE WITH INSTRUCTIONS



REPLACING BATTERIES

Tool required – small Phillips-head screw driver



Install 3 fresh AG13/LR44 button cell batteries only as indicated in the battery compartment

. Replace the battery compartment cover. Do not over-tighten screv

RIGHT ON TARGET

Part of the excitement of using your Expedition Sky Flare is launching it and seeing where it will land. In an open area or field, create a bull's-eye-style target by making a 6 to 8ft circle using some twine. Or, just pick a general spot for your target. Try to judge the

wind speed, then launch your flare and see how close to the target it lands. Become a Sky Flare master, seeing how accurately and frequently you can hit your target. Challenge your friends, too!

ON THE HUNT

Have you ever wanted to go on an expedition for hidden objects?
Or set out on adventure to uncover secret hiding places?
Now you can dojust that, right in your own backyard! Have your parents hide five objects around

your yard. Once they're done, start hunting for the hidden objects. When you find the first one, set off your Expedition Sky Flare so your parents can see that the hunt is a success! Continue your search for the rest of the objects, setting your flare off each time you find something. Will you become an expert explorer and find all five objects?
